

# PH.D. IN THE ANCIENT WORLD



Encompassing the ancient world from the western Mediterranean to East Asia, from the Neolithic to the early Medieval period, the **Institute for the Study of the Ancient World** is focused on creating a new generation of scholars whose work crosses over the disciplinary boundaries of traditional departments. In this way, knowledge of the cultures, art, languages, religions, economic systems, and interactions of the ancient world can be deepened and expanded. Doctoral students at ISAW have the opportunity to take research seminars, tutorials, and directed studies with ISAW's outstanding dedicated faculty. Students are also able to take courses in other NYU departments and at other universities in the metropolitan area. Additionally, the ISAW Visiting Research Scholar program brings in experts in a variety of fields from across the world who participate in the graduate seminars and present public lectures, serving as an additional vital resource for our students.

Matriculated students in good standing at ISAW receive five years of fellowship support as they progress successfully through the program and can apply for a sixth year of support. ISAW graduate fellowships cover the cost of tuition, fees, and health insurance premiums and provide an annual stipend, which is currently \$43,969 for the 2021-22 academic year. Students are also eligible to apply for departmental funding for conferences, research, and fieldwork.
